July Meeting Minutes

Meeting called to order at 7:00 PM by Post Commander Will Collard. 9 members present.

Colors advanced, prayers offered, POW/MIA empty chair recognized, and Preamble recited.

<u>Minutes:</u> A motion was made by Bruce Moran to dispense with the verbal reading of the Minutes since they were published in the newsletter and sent to all the members; seconded by Chris Lussier and unanimously approved.

<u>Treasurers Report:</u> The Treasurer's Report was read. The Post received \$245 from dues. Disbursements were \$291.70 for dues and \$27.96 for Eversource. Bruce Moran made a motion that the Treasurers Report be accepted as read, pending audit; seconded by John Weidman and unanimously approved.

Sick Call and Employment:

 John Weidman stated his wife has returned from Ukraine. She was there because her Godson was killed in a traffic accident shortly before returning to the war. The members

- expressed their condolences to John's family for their loss.
- Greg d'Arbonne stated his father is not doing well and is still at the rehab center.

<u>Membership:</u> Justin Adams has paid his dues from January through December 2023.

Correspondence: Nothing to report.

Old Business:

- Monument:
 - The members discussed when we could do a dedication of the Monument once it is erected. John Weidman stated any time is good as it can be erected, and we can hold a formal unveiling any date after that. The members agreed and are looking at some time after Labor Day.
 - The foundation has been delayed due to the constant wet weather.
 - o Jim Pope stated he investigated purchasing bricks and having them delivered. He stated engraving costs have increased since last he looked at this issue for the Historical Society.. It is estimated it will be \$21 to \$23 per line. The path from the sidewalk to the Monument is 46 feet and will take approximately 600+ bricks to do the walkway and the border around the Monument. Access will be ADA compliant. The walkway and border will be bordered

- by granite stones like the other monuments in front of Town Hall. It was agreed a landscaper should be hired to make the path and border. Bob Glover stated he will check on a brick company he knows and see what their price is.
- Greg d'Arbonne will create a PowerPoint file with a slide for each brick ordered so each can be reviewed for accuracy.
- Adding Wiliam Quigley's name to the Korea/Vietnam Monument: John Weidman will get this done. Greg d'Arbonne will send him the full name and ask the Town Administrator for the funds to accomplish this.
- Greg d'Arbonne made a motion that we request that the two trees in front of the Post be removed; seconded by Chris Lussier and unanimously approved. Greg will contact the tree removal service.

New Business:

- Bob Glover stated he will install the mailbox to the right of the front steps. All agreed this is a good location.
- Greg d'Arbonne stated Post member Justin Adams's grandfather, George Chandler, and an Army Veteran, died, and will be buried at the Brookline South Cemetery on the 4th of August. He asked that those who can attend let him know so we can support the funeral.
- The groundbreaking for the Easterseals facility in Franklin, NH will have their groundbreaking ceremony on 20 September.
 All Veterans are invited.



Operation Care for Troops Update

I am writing to you as Operation Care for Troops (OCT) is preparing for the August Care Package shipment to deployed troops. In August OCT expects to send care packages to 650 to 700 deployed troops. Of those, 294 are deployed NHNG Troops in the middle east and 215 deployed elsewhere. In September OCT will support Harbor Cares "Veterans' Stand Down" with requested items as well as 75 product bags geared to homeless & in-transition Veterans in NH.

Further, OCT is responding to many special requests from units. Recently, a special request from the NH National Guard with care packages filled with Hydration Drink Mix, protein bars and protein snacks.

For Operation Care for Troops to continue, we are in need of funds for shipping care packages (\$21.20 per box) and funds to purchase products. Donations can be mailed to: Operation Care for Troops, PO Box 1604, Nashua, NH 03061
