Minutes: A motion was made by Chris Lussier to dispense with the verbal reading of the Minutes since they were published in the newsletter and sent to all the members; seconded by Bruce Moran and unanimously approved.

Treasurers Report: The Treasurer's Report was read. The Post received \$545 from dues, and \$1,799.32 from the Boy Scouts for our portion of the Spaghetti Dinner in May. Disbursements were \$18.35 for Eversource; \$100 donation to the Hollis VFW for the Holiday Card shed; and \$600 for the tree removal. Chris Lussier made a motion that the Treasurers Report be accepted as read, pending audit; seconded by Bruce Moran and unanimously approved.

Membership: No one renewed in the past month. It was announced our dues will go up by \$15 next year because National is raising dues by \$15.
