May Meeting Minutes

Meeting called to order at 7:00 PM by Post Commander Will Collard. 11 members present.

Colors advanced, prayers offered, POW/MIA empty chair recognized, and Preamble recited.

Minutes: A motion was made by Bruce Moran to dispense with the verbal reading of the Minutes since they were published in the newsletter and sent to all the members; seconded by Bob Glover and unanimously approved.

Treasurers Report: The Treasurer's Report was read. The Post did not receive any funds this month. Disbursements for the Post were \$37.57 to Eversource. At the meeting, the Post received a check from the Hollis VFW for the flags the Post purchased for them; a total of \$325.98. Bruce Moran made a motion that the Treasurers Report be accepted as read, pending audit; seconded by Arlene d'Arbonne and unanimously approved.

Sick Call and Employment:

- Commander Will Collard stated his father-in-law is now in an assisted living facility.
- Greg d'Arbonne stated his father is still recovering from his broken leg and is now in a rehab center.
- Rita DeClemente, the wife of former Hollis VFW Post member John DeClemente, died the other day.

Membership: Justin Adams needs to pay his dues.

Correspondence: Nothing to report.

Old Business:

- Spaghetti Dinner, 13 May: All who attended said it went well. Greg d'Arbonne will ask how much was made at the event.
- Bob Glover stated he is waiting for the Milford Post Office to tell him where we should put the street mailbox.
- Jim Pope will ask Darrell Pelletier for a bucket truck so the solar lamp on the top of the flagpole can be replaced.
- Memorial Day Activities:
 - The members reviewed the various events at the schools.
 - Brookline Cemeteries and flag replacement on the graves, 27 May:
 - Bob Glover and Bill Graham took care of the Lakeside Cemetery and the small cemetery along Rt. 13.

- Post members are asked to meet at the South Cemetery (main Cemetery along Main St) at 9 AM. Greg d'Arbonne will bring a battery-operated drill and 5/16" drill bit to extract any flags that get stuck in their holders. Greg will also ask the Boy and Girl Scouts if they want to help.
- Poppy Distribution on Saturday, 27 May, at the Brookline Transfer Station:
 - 8 to 10 AM = Bob Glover and Pat Moquin
 - 10 AM to 12 PM = Pat Moquin
 - 12 to 2 PM = Arlene and Greg d'Arbonne
 - 2 to 4 PM = Jim Pope and Bobby Canada
- Memorial Day Ceremony, 29 May:
 - We will conduct the Brookline Ceremony at 9:30 AM in front of the Town Hall. Members are asked to be there by 9 AM.
 - The uniform for the event is a white shirt, tie, Navy Blue or dark sport coat, gray pants or dark pants, and Legion hat (if they have one).
 - Greg d'Arbonne picked up the wreaths and they are in the Legion Hall.
 - The model of the Monument will go in front of the Town Hall and be at the Transfer Station on Saturday.
 - We will do a "Coffee with a Vet" before the ceremony starting at 8 AM in front of Town Hall.
- The Hollis Memorial Day Ceremony will be on 29 May at 5:00 PM at the Common in Hollis. All are invited to attend.

New Business:

- Flag Retirement Ceremony: Greg d'Arbonne made a motion that we conduct a Flag Retirement Ceremony on 10 June at 10 AM; seconded by Bruce Moran and unanimously approved. Bill Graham suggested we contact the Fire Department about the fire for the ceremony to ensure we can do one.
- Bruce Moran made a motion that the Post remove the two trees directly in front of the

- Post; seconded by John Weidman and unanimously approved. Jim Pope will ask a Darrel Pelletier for a quote.
- John Weidman stated he touched up the stone flag at the South Cemetery as the colors on it had faded over the years.
- Monument issues:
 - John Weidman stated he will contact Jerry Farwell about digging the base for the Monument.
 - Greg d'Arbonne will pass to John Weidman the inscription the Post approved several months ago so John can start that process as well.
 - The members discussed when the Monument should be dedicated. It was decided that if the Monument could be erected by the 4th of July, that would be a good opportunity. Otherwise, we will look at an appropriate date when it is erected.
- Chris Lussier of the Hollis VFW spoke to the members and stated that the Hollis VFW was donating \$30,000 to the Monument and for bricks in honor of Hollis VFW members who have died. The members were very grateful for this generous donation from the Hollis Post. Chris also stated he would assist our Post in working with the local casino that helped the Hollis Post raise money.
 - Greg d'Arbonne made a motion that the Post pay for Chris Lussier's membership in our American Legion Post; seconded by Bruce Moran and unanimously approved.
 - Greg d'Arbonne made a motion that the inscription on the Monument also include Hollis Memorial Post 11373; seconded by John Weidman and unanimously approved.

For the Good of The Post:

- Bob Glover briefed the members on the recent State Convention. Bob stated Leo Pacquin is the new Department of New Hampshire Commander.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:58 PM. The next meeting is 22 June 2023.

Liberty House Pantry Current Needs


