October Meeting Minutes

Meeting called to order at 7:00 PM by Post 2nd Vice Commander Pat Moquin. 8 members were present and no guests.

Colors advanced, prayers offered, POW/MIA empty chair recognized, and Preamble recited.

Minutes: A motion was made by Bruce Moran to dispense with the verbal reading of the Minutes since they were published in the newsletter and sent to all the members; seconded by Arlene d'Arbonne and unanimously approved.

Treasurers Report: The Treasurer's Report was read. The Post received \$140 from dues. Disbursements were \$19.64 for Eversource. Bob Glover asked that everyone renew their membership as soon as possible. Bruce Moran made a motion that the Treasurers Report be accepted as read, pending audit; seconded by Chris Lussier and unanimously approved.

Membership: Bob Glover stated only 18 people have renewed for this year. Greg d'Arbonne will put a reminder in the newsletter for everyone to renew. Bob and Pat Moquin will also call members who have not yet renewed. Bob Barnes had asked if his renewal had been sent forward since his check had not been cashed yet, and Bob Glover stated the Legion headquarters at the State has it and should be cashing it soon. Everyone is reminded that you can renew your membership via cash, check, or online, whichever is easiest for you, but please do this as soon as you can if you have not already done so.

Sick Call and Employment:

 Greg d'Arbonne stated his father is now back at home with Greg's mother.

<u>Correspondence:</u> Nothing to report.

Old Business:

- Monument:
 - The foundation has been delayed due to the constant wet weather and will be delayed until Spring 2024.
 - Bricks for the pathway: A&B Masonry in Manchester offers bricks with a 20% discount. Based on the dimensions of the pathway and Monument, they estimated 650 bricks will be needed.
 - The placement of the verbiage on the column will start at 10 inches below the Seal of the Army.

- The members discussed that we need to start thinking about a dedication ceremony sometime around Memorial Day
- Greg d'Arbonne will send to John Weidman the information needed for adding Wiliam Quigley's name to the Korea/Vietnam Monument.
- Veterans Day: The schedule with the schools and the ceremony in Hollis are all set and published in the newsletter. Poppies will be distributed at the Brookline Transfer Station on 4 November. The schedule for distribution is:
 - 8 to 10 AM = Bob Glover and Pat Moguin
 - 10 to 12 PM = Greg and Arlene d'Arbonne
 - 12 to 2 PM = Jim Pope and Bobby Canada.
 - o 2 to 4 PM = Paul Ricci.

New Business:

 Chris Lussier asked if the Post can ask other American Legion Posts to help donate to the shed being built for the Holiday Card organization. Bob Glover made a motion that our Post donate \$100 toward this building; seconded by Greg d'Arbonne and unanimously approved. Bob Glover and Pat Moquin also stated they would each personally donate \$50 toward this effort. Chris Lussier stated it is very much appreciated by all this working on this project.

For the Good of The Post:

 The members discussed that the Post needs to have a new Adjutant learning from Greg d'Arbonne now before Greg's term ends on 30 June. It was discussed that while no one is indispensable, the Post Adjutant is a critical position for communicating with the members and we need a replacement very soon.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:28 PM. The next meeting is 16 November 2023.

Please Consider Becoming Our Post Adjutant

At our October meeting we had a long discussion about our need for someone to step up and take my place as the Adjutant for the Post. I know all of us are very busy in our lives and taking on more work seems daunting. So you understand; I have been the Adjutant/Secretary of our Legion Post for the past 17 + years. Prior to that I was the Post Commander for 3 years. That is 20 years of publishing a newsletter, producing the Minutes, and various other responsibilities. Before I became the Commander, correspondence with members was done purely by Post Office mail and not on a regular basis. Over the years I have moved us to using e-mail and other automated programs to make it easier to correspond and get information out to the membership. After 20 years of dedicated service, I need to step down to allow others to step forward and support our Veteran community. While I am stepping down, I will be available to help and support the Post and the new Adjutant. If you volunteer to be the next Post Adjutant, I will not leave you high and dry.

I ask you to consider what you can do for the Post, and if you can volunteer to be our new Adjutant, I know every member will be greatly appreciative of your decision. Veterans helping Veterans is how we get things done and take care of each other. Thanks.


Please Make Sure You Renew ASAP

News of Interest to Veterans


Help Build the Veteran Database at the NH Veterans Heritage Learning Center
