July 20th Meeting Minutes

Meeting Open Time: 7:00 PM at the Brookline American Legion Hall and via Zoom. 8 members were present.

Reading of the Minutes: A motion was made by Bruce Moran to dispense with the reading of the June meeting minutes with corrections since they were published in the newsletter and sent to all members and that topics will be reviewed in the meeting. Correction was the Hollis Memorial Day Service was at 1700 hours not 1500 hours. Greg d'Arbonne seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

Post Quartermaster's Report: The Quartermaster's Report was read. There was one deposit: \$7.62 from Interest; totaling \$7.62. Disbursements for the month were: \$200.00 for Daughters of the American Revolution for Hollis grave cleaning; \$192.00 for USPS Annual PO Box Fee (pre-authorized); and \$320.00 for cleaning services. Total expenses for a total of \$712.00. The Quarterly Report needs to be

approved by the trustees at the conclusion of the meeting. Bruce Moran made a motion that the Quartermaster's report be accepted as read, pending audit; seconded by Greg d'Arbonne, and unanimously approved. Quarterly Trustee Report of Audit was submitted.

- Email received from ZOOM for online meeting account renewal due on 20 August 2025. The total amount due is 159.40. Chris Lussier made the motion for the Post to pay ½ the fee for the renewal of the account, seconded by Greg d'Arbonne and unanimously approved.

Protein bars Chicken Vienna sausages


Lip balm--no petroleum please. Trail mix and any drink mixes
