Meeting Open Time: 7:00 PM at the Brookline American Legion Hall and via Zoom. 10 members were present and no guests.

Minutes: A motion was made by Bruce Moran to dispense with the verbal reading of the Minutes since they were published in the newsletter; seconded by Bob Smith and unanimously approved.

Quartermaster's Report: The Quartermaster's Report was read. The Post received an EFT of \$3.50 from National; \$200 from the Gun Raffle Ticket sales; and \$2.24 in interest from the bank. There were two disbursements, both to Aaron Crandlemere for building materials for the shed, for a total of \$1,173.57. Veterans in the 8th Grade Classrooms 5 April

On Friday, 5 April, the Hollis-Brookline Middle School will hold its annual Veterans with the 8th Grade Class program where the Veterans talk to the 8th Graders before they go on their trip to Washington, DC. This is a great program where the students get to ask us Veterans various questions about our time in the military. The questions are wide ranging but generally focus on what we ate and what did we do while we were in the military. Your service does not have to be extra-ordinary or only wartime experience; the students want to know what we all did. It is also a great chance for you to connect with students that you may not normally meet. A great program for the students and the Veterans alike. The school asks that you arrive at the Middle School by 8:30 AM. We will speak to the students from 9 to 9:55, then, 10 to 10:55, then, lunch (provided) with the students from 11 to 11:30.


Points To Ponder
