May Meeting Minutes

Meeting Open Time: 7:00 PM at the Brookline American Legion Hall and via Zoom. 7 members were present.

Minutes: A motion was made by Bruce Moran to dispense with the verbal reading of the Minutes since they were published in the newsletter; seconded by Chris Lussier and unanimously approved.

Quartermaster's Report: The Quartermaster's Report was read. There was one deposit for \$1.06 from Interest. There were several disbursements made for the Shed Project, for a total of \$2,105.98; a disbursement to the Department of New Hampshire for dues for \$9; and a disbursement to the Hollis Transfer Station to dispose of construction waste for \$5. Bruce Moran made a motion that the Quartermaster's report be accepted as read, pending audit; seconded by Bob Smith, and unanimously approved.

Committee Reports:

- Patriots' Pen presentation will be on the 18th of June at 7:30 AM at the Middle School. George Robinson will get the gift cards for the awardees. George stated the theme for the Patriot's Pen and Voice of Democracy for next year have been announced and he will get them to the local schools, to include the Montessori School in Hollis.
- The winner of the High School College Scholarship was given to the school.
- Service Officer: nothing to report.
- George Robinson stated Troop 12 will have five boys receiving their Eagle Rank next month. The ceremony is on 9 June at 2 PM at the Lawrence Barn. Greg d'Arbonne stated Troop 260 in Brookline will have one boy receive his Eagle Rank in August.

Membership: Nothing to report.

Comrade in Distress:

- Jeff Smith stated he had Cataract surgery for one eye, and they will do the other eye in a couple of weeks. He is doing well.
- Greg d'Arbonne stated his Cardio Ablation procedure went well.

Old Business:

- Post Elections: Chris Lussier stated he submitted the Post Election Report, but it is incomplete without a name for the Post Adjutant. He will submit his name as a placeholder, but we need to select someone ASAP.
- Memorial Day 2024 Activities:
 - Greg d'Arbonne will bring the MIA Table items to the Hollis Ceremony.
 - George Robinson will be the Guest Speaker.
 - Chris Lussier made a motion that the Post pay Wayne Letourneau \$150 to run the sound system, and that this be billed to the Town of Hollis as a cost for the ceremony; seconded by Bruce Moran and unanimously approved.
 - Chris Lussier discussed taking care of the Veterans graves at the Beth Abraham Cemetery in Nashua. The Post will meet there as planned and will simply identify Veteran graves so the Post can buy markers at a future date once the number is known.
 - Poppy Distribution Schedule: George Robinson stated he will come during the timeframe to allow Bruce Moran to take a break.

 Shed update: Greg d'Arbonne made a motion that the Post allocate an additional \$2,0000 to cover costs; seconded by Bob Smith and unanimously approved.

Remember National Home: Prayer was said for the National Home and residents.

General Orders: As distributed by the Department and District and posted on the Department website.

Correspondence: Nothing received.

New Business:

- Chris Lussier stated he and Pat Moquin picked up the handicap ramps from a home in Brookline and the ramps are now behind the Legion Hall for anyone that needs them.
- Ramp for Bruce Moran's House: as of right now, Annmarie is still in rehab. When she comes home, a ramp will allow her to get in and out of the house as needed. Chris Lussier made a motion that the Post expend \$500 to build the ramp; seconded by Bob Smith and unanimously approved.

For the Good of the Order:

 Greg d'Arbonne stated he and Bruce performed as the "4 Vets" for the Tilton Veterans Home and for the Delta Dog fund raiser. Both events were very well received.
