# **September 21st Meeting Minutes**

Meeting Open Time: 7:00 PM at the Brookline | accepted as read, pending audit; seconded by American Legion Hall and via Zoom. 7 members and 1 quest were present.

Reading of the Minutes: A motion was made by Bruce Moran to dispense with the reading of the August meeting minutes since they were published in the September newsletter and sent to all members and that topics will be reviewed in the meeting. Andy Seremeth seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

**Post** Quartermaster's Report: The Quartermaster's Report was read. There was one deposit: \$6.92 from Interest; total deposits \$6.92. Disbursements for the month were: \$525.00 for Quartermaster bond renewal to \$150,000; \$95.00 to Jim Belanger for website; \$320.00 to Patricia Dutra for cleaning services; \$86.00 District 6 dues; and \$250.00 for insurance renewal. Total expenses \$1,276.00. Bruce Moran made a motion that the Quartermaster's report be Greg d'Arbonne, and unanimously approved.

### Correspondence:

- District 6 Meeting The district meeting focused on ways to improve membership, and program reporting. The Teacher of the Year nominations, Voice of Democracy (VOD), and Patriots Pen activities were highlighted. The VOD and Patriots Pen activities will all be done online through the Department of NH site.
- National Membership report from Paul Lloyd 80%. Our post needs 9 Members to renew and three new members to join.
- Paul Lloyd notification of Veterans Breakfast every other Sunday at the Franklin Post beginning 21 September.
- Email from Paul Lloyd notifying National Bylaws change. At the 126th National Convention, delegates adopted an

amendment to the Veterans of Foreign Wars National Bylaws that changes the official title of Post Service Officer and District Service Officer to Benefits Advisor.

This change becomes effective thirty (30) days from the adjournment of the National Convention.

All Departments, Districts, Posts, and VFW employees are directed to ensure this information is disseminated to the lowest organizational level. Further, all members and employees must take the necessary steps to update all correspondence, guides, websites, forms, catalogs, directories, training materials, and any other official documents they may have control of to reflect the new title in order to remain in compliance with the National Bylaws.

- Patriot's Pen Program: HBMS Social Studies teachers and the principal confirmed that they will once again be supporting the Patriots' Pen contest with the 8th grade. They have the theme.
- Voice of Democracy programs: The VOD theme was passed to Trevor Duval at HBHS to share with his Civics and AP U.S. History students and the Social Studies department.
- Military Descendant Scholarship: George Robinson gave the announcement to the HBHS

Guidance office for posting in Naviance as a scholarship opportunity.

### • Americanism:

 8 September – 6 Veterans attended Town Hall Community meeting to observe the CONSTITUITION WEEK Proclamation given to DAR by the Hollis Selectmen.

# • Community Service:

- 8 September 6 Veterans visited Freddie's wonderful Historic Tavern, 28 Main Street, for wine, cheese, sodas, snacks and fun socializing.
- 20 September Bruce Moran, Kerry Spangler, and Chris Lussier participated in the Hollis Old Home Days parade presenting Chris Lussier's WWII era Willys.
- 3, 10, 17, and 24 September Weekly Veteran's Breakfasts in Hollis with numerous veterans from the community.

## Safety (Home/Fire):

- 29 July In alignment with 'Day of Service' members built 2 sets of steps to accompany a handicap access for a Vietnam Vet and his wife to prevent a fall.
- 29 August Two sets of handrails were installed on two sets of porch steps of a veteran's home ensuring safe access to yard area.

### Youth Activities:

 20 September – Several members talked with numerous kids about various facets of military service and life. Several recognized members from seeing us at the many school activities and programs we support. One of these in particular was recognizing Chris as the "Old Flag Presentation" he has done many times over the years. Many stated that our interactions with them gave them a new perspective on the military.

## Legislative:

 22 August – A small private informal group session and breakfast (hosted by Dr. Laura Landeman-Garber and Dr. Ben Garber) met with NH US Senator Maggie Hassan and two of her staff. Dialog involved several veteran concerns presented to Senator Hassan. Included was a discussion of the retroactive veterinarian support for service dogs for dogs provided by a non-accredited organization once accreditation is achieved (a nationwide problem. Also concerns for timely VA medical care were discussed. Government efficiency and National debt were also topics of discussion.

- 18 September 4 Members attended the Franklin Military and Veterans Campus Ribbon Cutting, tours and celebration.

# Veterans and Military Support:

 18 September – Franklin Military and Veterans Campus Ribbon Cutting 4 Vets sang.

**Remember National Home:** Prayer was said for the National Home and residents.

**General Orders:** As distributed by the Department and District and posted on the Department website.

### **Old Business:**

- At the June meeting, George Robinson stated that with the Nation's 250th Birthday coming up next year, the Post should purchase banners celebrating this event and place them at the major crossroads in both Towns, a total of 8 banners. George will investigate costs, what needs to be done and permissions that are needed. It was agreed that he attend the select board meeting to discuss.
- George Robinson has not presented the 250th telephone pole banner idea to Hollis or Brookline yet because he wanted members to be aware of a better cost estimate before doing so. He requested a quote from a local vendor in Amherst, but doesn't have it, yet. He is also trying to track down the company that Bedford used for their town anniversary banners, which have held up well and retained their color for the last many months. The prices from online resources vary wildly, but the one he is most comfortable with is about \$145 per banner, including mounting hardware. That's about twice the cost anticipated when the idea was presented, so he doesn't think we should move forward with the offer to the towns until members can vote on an actual price...unless they're prepared to authorized "not to exceed \$1500 for 10 banners", which is a pretty high price tag. As soon as he has the 2 other quotes, he'll share them. (OPEN)
- Our Day of Service event (postponed from 3 May due to weather) steps were completed 29 July. Remaining work is handrails. The handrails were completed 29 August. Greg d'Arbonne made a motion for reimbursement to Chris Lussier \$429.50 for materials to complete the Bruce Moran Memorial Bridge project, seconded by Bruce Moran and unanimously approved. (CLOSED)
- Kerry Spangler proposed changes to the By-Laws to indicate meetings being the 3rd Sunday each month with the exception of June being the 4th Sunday because of the conflict with Father's Day. Jim Belanger seconded the motion and was unanimously approved. Kerry Spangler has drafted the

changes and sent the draft with the monthly Newsletter for review for approval at the July meeting No comments received. Final copy will be signed and Kerry Spangler will take to the District 6 Meeting in August for District Approval. Editor's Note: Bylaws were submitted to Department Adjutant Paul Lloyd.) (OPEN)

- Kerry Spangler has developed a spreadsheet to use as a checklist for all events being worked by the Post. Assistance in identifying all the components of all events will be required. (OPEN)
- Chris Lussier and Kerry Spangler met with the Gate City Casino coordinator to get the final dates for the Hollis VFW charitable gaming the week of September 9th. (OPEN)
- Membership staffing for the membership drive at Old Home Days. Chris Lussier and Kerry Spangler will be there for the duration. Members will also participate in the Hollis Old Home Days parade. Kerry Spangler will bring applications to the drive. Need to ask the scouts to perform color guard. Kerry Spangler will reach out to George Robison to request the scouts. Chris Lussier will pick up the flags for display at the membership drive and Kerry Spangler will return them to the Post. (CLOSED)
- Veterans Day Ceremony will begin at 11:00, November 11th at the Hollis Community Church at Memorial Square. Greg d;Arbonne will be the master of ceremony and Chris Lussier will be the guest speaker. We also need to identify a guest speaker. It was recommended we keep the same timeframe and format as in the past Veteran's Day events. Greg d'Arbonne will be the Master of Ceremony, Chris Lussier will be the guest speaker. Chris will provide the PA, Greg will bring the lecturn. There are several activities at the schools with dates and times published in the October Newsletter.(OPEN)
- We need to renew the Quartermaster bond. Greg d'Arbonne made a motion to increase the bond to \$150,000 from the current \$75,000. The motion was seconded by Mark

Andrews and unanimously approved. The bond was submitted and received. (CLOSED)


