Operation Care for Troops Update

I am writing to you as Operation Care for Troops (OCT) is preparing for the August Care Package shipment to deployed troops. In August OCT expects to send care packages to 650 to 700 deployed troops. Of those, 294 are deployed NHNG Troops in the middle east and 215 deployed elsewhere. In September OCT will support Harbor Cares "Veterans' Stand Down" with requested items as well as 75 product bags geared to homeless & in-transition Veterans in NH.

Further, OCT is responding to many special requests from units. Recently, a special request from the NH National Guard with care packages filled with Hydration Drink Mix, protein bars and protein snacks.





Vietnam Veterans Day Commemoration 2023

Before we went to Vietnam there was division within the nation about why we were there.

While we were there there was division within the nation about our on going involvement and national service.

On our return there was division within the nation as to how we should be treated.

There were tribes for and against the war, for and against us.

There was no division within our Vietnam war forces, despite our land force being as diverse as it comes, there were no tribes.

We were made up of first nation members, others born here, others born in at least 37 other countries in such far away places as Russia, Poland, South America, The Falkland Islands to name a few, and even two born in German concentration camps. Links to their homelands ran deep, for some English was their second language.

Our soldiers were from all walks of life. Off the land, city slickers, skilled and unskilled, tradies and professionals, early school leavers, highly educated, wise in the ways of the world and the naïve.

They followed different religious beliefs and had different political leanings, differing skin colours, and different accents, some had strange-sounding names that reflected their heritage. They were either conscripted and went happily or begrudgingly to do their duty, or they were professional soldiers wedded to the military. Some were very young, some older.

But it mattered not to all of them, the only thing that mattered was the green of their uniform, worn by all from the private soldier to the generals. In Vietnam we were one tribe. One tribe in purpose, one tribe depending on each other, a one nation tribe, and all of one colour, green.

50 years on, we remain undivided, still drawn together not by race, or heritage but by the green of our uniforms and our shared war experiences.

Vietnam veterans, drawn together by our service in green, the only colour that mattered then, and the only colour that matters now.
